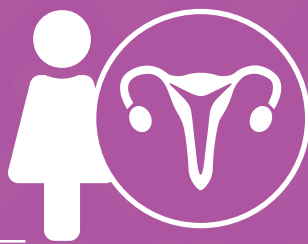




Cervical Cancer Awareness




Estimated number of new cases of cervical cancer diagnosed in 2019:
951 females









Estimated % of all new female cancer cases diagnosed in 2019: **1.4%**

Estimated number of deaths from cervical cancer 2019:
256 females  

Chance of surviving at least 5 years (2011 – 2015): **74%** 



Estimated risk  of a female dying from cervical cancer by her 85th birthday will be **1 in 494**

Cervical cancer  is the 19th most common cause of death     from cancer among females in 2019.

Females living with cervical cancer at the end of 2015 (diagnosed in the 5 year period 2010 to 2014): **3,319**

Cervical cancer can be prevented  when girls 11+ get the HPV vaccine
